Areas of Integration are Proclamation (AIP), Service (AIS), and Community/Church (AIC)

The following four options are available in the MDiv Program:

1. **Basic MDiv** (no practicum): 63 course credits, 6 colloquia credits, 9 United Church of Canada credits, 3 capstone credits. Total credits 81
2. **Honours Basic MDiv** (no practicum): includes honours thesis (6 credits) in place of two Level II/III courses. Total credits 81
3. **Practicum MDiv**: includes an additional 9 practicum credits. Total credits 90
4. **Honours Practicum MDiv**: includes an additional 9 practicum credits and honours thesis (6 credits) in place of two Level II/III courses. Total credits 90

In addition to courses, students will be expected to fulfill non-credit program requirements SAC100.

MTS Areas of study include:

The following two options are available in the MTS Program. Both have 54 credits:

1. MTS 54 credit: 36 course credits, 9 colloquia/capstone credits, 9 college/specialization credits
2. MTS Honours: 30 course credits, 9 colloquia/capstone credits, 9 college/specialization credits, 6 thesis credits
